The “DeKalb Report” will be re-examined and updated as a part of the Third AHIMT – TEC in Denver this year. Dr. Amy Donahue from the University of Connecticut has again volunteered to administer the study process.

The study done in 2008 in DeKalb, Illinois at the First AHIMT – TEC to determine the most important issues facing the sponsors and members of AHIMTs embodied attendee input and has been a positive influence for Federal, Tribal, State and Local agencies for the development, deployment and maintenance of AHIMTs. The “DeKalb Report” has become an important reference for DHS policy-makers.

The study update will be a three-part process that **all registered attendees** are encouraged to participate in. The first part will be an on-line questionnaire which **all registered attendees** will be asked to finish prior to arriving at the Conference. The second part will be participation in small group discussions during the conference to determine the pressing issues facing AHIMTs at all levels. The third part will be vetting the results of the study at the conclusion of the Conference.

Only registered attendees of the AHIMT – TEC will be able to participate in the revision of the “DeKalb Report”. Starting next week and continuing until November 12, 2010, a web link will be sent to **all registered attendees** that will allow them to begin the revision process by taking the on-line questionnaire. Anyone who registers after November 12, 2010, may take the questionnaire at the Conference.
